- The Scholarship is awarded to an adoptable dog, the handler and the shelter/rescue group jointly and specifically. No substitutions are allowed.
- The handler agrees to attend class regularly.
- The handler will provide follow up information as requested by the GSLTC Shelter and Rescue Outreach Committee regarding the dog's progress in class, completion date, and adoption outcome.
- A dog with a history of growling, snapping, or biting will require a GSLTC Behavior Evaluation at the expense of the shelter or rescue organization.
- Revocation of Scholarship: The Committee has the right to revoke a Scholarship under the following circumstances: Absenteeism (missing two classes in a series, without an acceptable reason); inability of the handler to manage the dog in class; unsuitability of the dog to a particular class. If a dog is found to be unsuitable for a particular class, another type of class may be suggested and the shelter/rescue group may reapply for a scholarship for the new class. Should the dog be adopted prior to the conclusion of the series of classes, the scholarship will end and the adoptive family will be encouraged to register for class as regular clients of the GSLTC.
- A scholarship to Foundation Manners Class grants the opportunity to attend 5 classes within 6 consecutive weeks.
- A scholarship to Shy Dog Class or Reactive Dog Class grants the opportunity to attend class for one session (currently 8 consecutive weeks for Shy Dog Class and 6 consecutive weeks for Reactive Dog Class).
- The Shelter or Rescue must have a current license.
